**Reflection Paper Rubric**  
Decide what rubric you will use (e.g., holistic or analytic, and how many points). Apply the holistic rubric by marking comments and sorting the students' assignments into stacks (e.g., five stacks if using a five-point scale). Finally, check the stacks for consistency and mark the scores.

Rubrics for Experiential Learning Rubrics are a great tool for any instructor to have in their arsenal of assessments. Despite the common assumption that all rubrics are the same, rubrics can be constructed in many different forms and for many different purposes. It is important to know the different types of rubrics and what purpose they serve.

**Rubrics for Experiential Learning**  
Ash and Clayton recommend several ways instructors may use their framework to assess students' reflection. One way is to use a rubric; they provide the top level of achievement for the critical thinking rubric they use for assessing articulated learning statements:.

**Appendix 3: Sample rubrics for assessment**  
Rubrics will be the easiest way to gather aggregate information (more than the "n of 1") from your reflection papers, journals, etc. Choosing a rubric may involve determining if you want to see a specific outcome (e.g., critical thinking) in the reflections or if you are just looking for deeper understanding or more sophisticated thinking over time.
