We show this act of possession by adding a possessive ending, typically an "apostrophe -s" (Fred's report) to a singular noun and "just an apostrophe" to a plural noun (the persons' rights) (but children's toys). Here's the rule for nouns: Form the possessive of all singular nouns, even those ending in -s by adding "apostrophe -s."

How to Create Possessives. You use possessives to indicate who owns what. If Squiggly owns a car, you say, "This is Squiggly's car." You use an apostrophe plus an "s" on the end of "Squiggly." You can also form a possessive by using the word "of," such as "The Crown Jewels of the United Kingdom." (Of course, you could also say, "the United Kingdom's Crown Jewels.")

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The possessive form is used with nouns referring to people, groups of people, countries, and animals. It shows a relationship of belonging between one thing and another. To form the possessive, add apostrophe + s to the noun. If the noun is plural, or already ends in s, just add an apostrophe after the s.

Most writers don't have trouble with the possessive pronouns my, mine, his, her, and our. It's your, yours, hers, its, ours, their, and theirs, that tend to cause the confusion.
