Spread an even coat of adhesive onto the underside of the exposed seam (photo 1). Then use a wooden seam roller to flatten the seam (photo 2).

Place the pointed nozzle of the seam adhesive under the loose edge, seam, or tear and squeeze enough adhesive to coat the torn area. Don't apply so much that it get drippy.

Use a sharp utility knife and straightedge to cut the wallpaper. To make a patch, cut a square larger than the existing area to be patched and align the pattern. Use masking tape or tacks to attach the patch to the wall. Cut through the patch and the wallpaper with a utility knife and straightedge as shown at left.

To fix an air-filled wallpaper bubble, you'll need a utility knife, a syringe, glue, a damp sponge, and a roller. 1 Use the utility knife to slit the bubble. Be sure to keep the slit as small as possible so it won't be visible when the repair is done. 2 Push down on the bubble to remove the air from the bubble.

Step 1 Wash the walls with a mixture of wallpaper paste remover or 1 part vinegar to 4 parts water, to remove all remaining wallpaper glue. Scrub them with a rough cloth or abrasive sponge, then rinse them with clear water and clean rags. Allow the wall to dry.
