### **3. Keys, Scales & Technical Names Exercises**

In this column, I'd like to discuss some really cool major- and minor-scale exercises that will help your overall guitar playing on many levels. EXAMPLES 1 and 2 are a major and a natural minor scale, respectively, over three octaves spanning from the sixth string to the first string. At first look, it seems harmless enough.

Technical Names: Examples in Major Scales Before we move on to some examples, keep in mind that the term 'degree' in music refers to the position of a note within its scale. So the first degree is the first note of the scale; the second degree is the second note of the scale and so on.
